

We hope this message finds you well. We're reaching out today with an *important request* that is close to our hearts.

The **Aurora Cultural Arts District (ACAD)** has always stood for *creativity, inclusivity, and the power of the arts*. Over the past years, we've faced challenges that tested our resilience, including the impact of the pandemic and the loss of our former space. However, we've emerged *stronger and more determined* than ever to continue our mission.

Our new home at 10201 E Colfax is more than just a building. It's a haven for underrepresented artists to share their stories, a hub for cultural exchange, and a place where the community comes together to celebrate the arts. The Colfax art jams epitomize this spirit, serving as a platform for live entertainment, community bonding, and the celebration of creativity.

Today, we're faced with a *critical situation*. The **grants we relied upon have diminished significantly**, leaving us with *less than half of our expected funding*. This shortfall has impacted our ability to pay contractors, staff, and operational costs for our events and activities. We're determined to keep supporting artists and fostering a vibrant arts scene in our community, but we can't do it alone.

We're asking for your support to help us bridge the gap. Our goal is to raise **\$30,000** to cover the funding shortfall and ensure that ACAD continues to be a *beacon for creativity and connection*. Every contribution, no matter the size, makes a *real impact*. Your support will help us pay our dedicated team, keep the lights on, and provide a platform for artists' voices to shine.








Blues In The Night

*** Notification of Acceptance: Selected artists will be notified by November 5th.- We do not send rejection letters all applications remain on file. Sales and Fundraising: All artwork will be available for purchase, with a percentage of the proceeds benefiting the Aurora Cultural Arts District. Important Notes: Artwork must be ready to hang or display (framed and wired). All works must be gallery-ready and able to hang on the STAS gallery hanging system.

Artists are responsible for the delivery and pickup of their artwork. The Aurora Cultural Arts District reserves the right to photograph and promote exhibited works.

We encourage a diverse range of artistic expressions to make "Artful Holidays" a rich and varied exhibition. Here are the types of artwork we are particularly interested in:

- Paintings and Drawings: Both traditional and contemporary paintings and drawings are welcome. This includes oil, acrylic, watercolor, ink, pastel, and pencil works.
- Photography: Captivating photographs that capture the essence of the holiday season, local landscapes, or unique perspectives.
- Printmaking: Fine art prints created through various techniques such as etching, linocut, woodcut, or silk screen.

Jim Schrimshaaw Solo Art Exhibition


October 13th, 6;30-8 pm Open Wed- Saturday 11-2 pm until Nov 5th, 2023



From Prison Walls To Gallery Halls


